58. The highest point in East Sussex? *Ditchling Beacon (Checked by 2 independent map readers on OS & it is definitely not Crowborough)*
59. Sussex County Croquet Club? *Southwick*
60. The place where King Canute ordered the waves to go back? *Bosham*
61. A country park with the same name as a well-known author? *Buchan Country Park, Crawley*
62. A café designed by Thomas Heatherwick? *Littlehampton seafront*
